Content

This course aims at developing a self-critical perspective by providing the student with tools for criticism and assessment of own and others' design work. This takes place through concept development, critical review and comparison, as well as concrete form and material development of a previous design work. The main content of the course is as follows:

- Knowledge of tools, methods, and concepts for criticism of own and others' work
- Presentation and discussion of concepts for critical review of design work
- Critical review and deconstruction of own and others' design work
- Further development of own and other's design work
- Documentation

Learning Outcomes

On completion of the course, students will be able to:

1. demonstrate knowledge of tools, methods, and concepts for criticism of own and others' work,
2. critically evaluate own and other's textile design work,
3. demonstrate skills and abilities to edit and develop design work.

Forms of Teaching

Tuition consists of lectures, seminars and supervision.

The language of instruction is English.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

- Independent creative work 3,0 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)
- Documented presentation and reflections on the result and the process 1,5 credits Grading scale: Fail (U)/Pass (G)

For the grade passed on the entire course, an approved grade is required for all parts.
