Content

The course is aimed at international students who have no previous knowledge of the Swedish language. During the course, basic Swedish grammar and vocabulary linked to everyday life will be reviewed. The course also provides some orientation to Swedish social life and culture.

Learning Outcomes

After completing the course, the student will be able to:

1. Knowledge and understanding

1.1 recognise common words and very simple phrases that apply to the student, as well as the student's immediate surroundings

1.2 understand common words and very simple sentences

2. Skills and abilities

2.1 ask and answer questions in everyday subject areas

2.2 use simple phrases and sentences to describe, for example, housing and hobbies, e.g. everyday life

2.3 write short, simple messages, e.g. email, fill in personal information in simpler forms

3. Evaluation ability and approach

3.1 contrast Swedish culture and Swedish social life with the student's experiences from other cultures and other societies

Forms of Teaching

The course consists of:

- lectures
- workshops

The languages of instruction are English and Swedish.

Forms of Examination

The course will be examined through the following examination elements:

Swedish Language and Culture

Learning outcomes: 1.1, 1.2, 2.1, 2.2, 3.1

Pre-education credits: 7.5

Grading scale: Seven-degree grading scale (A-F)
Additional information: Written presentation
